PE & Sport Premium for Primary Schools 2016 - 2017

When London was chosen to host the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games the organisers decided to use the games to 'inspire a generation' and leave a legacy which inspired young people to play more sport. As a result, the government decided to spend £450,000,000 on improving physical education and sport in primary schools.
